

Crochet Diamond Mesh Triangle Scarf



This is a very simple scarf that can be made in an hour, using any yarn with a suitably-sized hook. It uses only two types of stitch – a chain (ch) and a single crochet (sc), used to form loops. Increase only on one side, usually the one opposite the yarn tail. The chain 4 at the ends of one side are the increases. With most weights of yarn, you will need less than 50g, so it's great for using up scrap yarn. The tail end can be woven through the wide end to make a pull through scarf.

To go around the neck, comfortably, and allow it to be threaded, the scarf will need to be at least 34"/86 cm long.

Instructions:

Chain 4. Join to first ch with a sc. (1st row – 1 loop)

Ch 4, turn and join to the sc just made. Ch 3, and join to the space created by the first loop in the 1st row, turn. (2nd row – two loops)

Ch 3, join to the ch space just made with a sc. Ch 3 and join to the next loop. (3rd row – two loops).

Ch 4, join to the sc of the row below, ch 3, join with sc in to next loop, ch 3 join with sc into final loop. (4th row – three loops).

Continue as 3rd row until you wish to increase, then repeat the 4th row, being sure to always do it on the same side. The other side will be straight.

An optional row of sc can be used to finish the wide end – 1 sc in sc, 2 sc (or 3) in ch 3 loop across.

Finish off and weave in ends.
