

Tunnel Bag Scarf



This scarf is made in two parts - a long scarf knit lengthwise, and the 'bag' to which it is attached and rolled into. The image shows a B&B 'culvert and stream' version, but other possibilities include other tunnels, animal faces, mail boxes, or whatever your imagination decides. The bag may be plain knit and embroidered with eyes, a tunnel, or other accents, later. This 'tunnel' was made using standard colour changes. The scarf was crocheted.

Choose colours of yarn and appropriate needles/hook.

First knit or crochet the scarf, in stripes or colour(s) of choice, lengthwise, to the length desired. The one shown is about 5" (12.5cm) wide, 48" (115cm) long, crocheted from knitting worsted.

Choose colours for the bag and knit a rectangle about 12" (30cm) long and about 2" (5cm) wider than the scarf. Fold it in half lengthwise, and join it at the sides. Join the bottom, leaving space for the scarf width. Attach one end of the scarf to the back/top of the inside of the bag. Accordion fold the scarf to fit the bag, positioning the lower end of the scarf on the top or bottom, pointed to the opening, so it can easily be pulled out.

When worn, the bag can be used to tuck the end of the scarf into, or tucked inside a coat.
